

*Batting: Pellon fleece, Warm and Natural, fusible fleece, flannel. Keep it THIN! You may skip adding batting if your machine has difficulties with all the layers. Fuse BATTING (C) to wrong side of the BACK (B) or place when indicated in the instructions.

Suggested fabrics: Cottons or quilting cottons. Linings may also be made from regular lining fabric to help reduce bulk.

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Special Precautions

You will be hooping only the stabilizer. It needs to be tight in the hoop with no slippage. You do not want the project to start sagging part way through.

You will be taking the hoop on and off the machine a number of times. Be very careful not to move the embroidery unit. Also be very careful not to disturb the project in the hoop. Place it on a flat surface while working. This will help keep the project from shifting in the hoop while you work.

If you tape the pieces down, don't put the tape right against the seam allowance. Some machines do not behave well when the foot is running over tape. The foot will drag causing skipped stitches as well as broken threads and needles. You can tape across the corners instead of on the sides.

Please stay with your machine at all times. Watch that the foot does not become caught in the fabric layers.

In case of broken needle or thread

If you need to go back during the sew-out, remove the hoop, and return to the START of the color stop. Return the hoop to the machine and then advance the needle to the position where you wish to start. You do NOT want the foot passing over the center of the project at any time – it is too thick and will stop the foot as it tries to cross. Adjust these instructions per your machine's behavior.

1 Strap Loops		
Hoop mid-weight cutaway stabilizer. Load <i>1Loop75_MV</i> into the machine.		
1	Stitch Color #1, the placement for the loops.	
2A	Remove the hoop from the machine turning it over to the BACK. Place it on a flat surface.	
28	Center one marine vinyl STRAP LOOP (A) FACE UP over the placement stitches. Tape to stabilizer with transpore tape.	
2C	Turn the hoop over to the FRONT and place it on a flat surface.	
2D	Center the remaining marine vinyl STRAP LOOP (A) FACE UP over the placement stitches. <i>Tape to stabilizer with transpore</i> <i>tape</i> .	
2E	Return the hoop to the machine. Stitch Color #2 using a contrasting thread color. This tacks the vinyl to the stabilizer and estabilishes the cutting lines. <i>Skip this step if you precut the pieces on your cutting machine.</i>

8A	Remove the hoop from the machine. Place it RIGHT SIDE UP on a flat surface.		
8B	OPEN THE ZIPPER HALFWAY! DO NOT SKIP THIS STEP! Take a sharp pair of scissors and poke a small hole through the stabilizer showing in the zipper opening. This will make it easier to trim the backing away later		
8C	Turn the hoop over so the back of the hoop is FACE UP. Place on a flat surface. Remove tape from linings and zipper.		
8D	 Fold both layers of lining downward at the seam line. Linings 1 and 2 are now the only linings visible. The pocket lining has been folded inside. The lower raw edges should extend about ½" below the bottom stitching line. Smooth the linings. Tape/pin the side and lower edges in place 		
8E	Turn the hoop over to the RIGHT side and place it on a flat surface.		

8F	Fold optional POCKET (H) in half, WRONG SIDES TOGETHER so it measures 6.75 x 6.5" (7.25 x 7"). Slide POCKET STIFFENER (I) inside pocket.
8G	 Place POCKET over the FRONT. The <i>folded edge</i> should line up with the 2 little placement lines stitched about halfway up on the two long edges. The raw edges will overlap the tackdown stitches at the sides and bottom of the purse by approximate ½". If you used a directional print, place the pocket so the "good" side is against the purse fabric. Tape/pin the outer edges in place.
NOTE	Note the short lines coming in from the top (left) edge – arrows in the example. These are the alignment lines for the strap loops.
8G	Place one of the LOOPS FACE DOWN, centered between the small alignment marks at the top left of the Back. The top seam line on the purse should be about halfway between the end of the loop and the stitching line on the loop. Tape in place with transpore tape, keeping it out of the seam line (1/4" INSIDE the current sewing line). Tape in place at raw edges, keeping tape away from the stitching line.
8H	Place the second LOOP FACE DOWN, centered between the small alignment marks at the top right of the BACK. The top seam line on the purse should be about halfway between the end of the tab and the stitching line on the tab. Tape in place with transpore tape, keeping it out of the seam line (1/4" INSIDE the current sewing line).

81	Place the BACK (B) over the project in the hoop, FACE DOWN.
	Match the 4 corners on both pieces as closely as possible. Tape/pin securely on all four edges <i>keeping the tape/pins away from the stitching lines.</i>

NOTE	If not using a prepared BACK (B), place the BATTING (C) over the project in the hoop, matching cut edges.
	Place remaining Lining 2 (F) FACE UP over the project in the hoop, covering the outer stitching lines matching cut edges.
	Tape/pin in place.

8K	Return the hoop to the machine. Did I mention to double check that the zippers are open halfway? Stitch Color #6. I usually match the thread to the outside fabric, not the lining so it isn't seen on the edges once the case is turned right side out.
NOTE	It will go around once with a basting stitch. You can stop the machine if necessary and easily remove this round of stitches if you get a pucker or the fabric shifts.
Z	The second and third rounds of stitching are a regular length sewing stitch.
9	DO NOT STITCH COLOR #9. It is there to keep the foot from returning to the center of the embroidery.
	Remove the hoop from the machine and the project from the hoop. Remove all tape and pins.
10	One last time, check that the zippers are open halfway. It is too late to fix it after you trim! If you forgot to open it, carefully open the seam; push the zipper pull through to the inside. Stitch the case shut on your regular sewing machine.

	Trim away all excess fabric and stabilizer trimming as close you can to the zigzag stitching without cutting thru it. Cut right thru the zipper but don't use your best shears!		
11	Do not trim the ends of any cording that might ravel. Leave them at least $\frac{1}{2}$ " long and apply fray check to the ends.		
	You can cut away the stitching at the corners that were for placement stitching, but do not cut into any of the zigzag stitches. The narrower your seam allowance, the better your curved seams will look without having to clip them.		
12	Trim away the excess stabilizer from the back of the zipper, starting in the slit you cut in the stabilizer earlier. Be very careful not to cut the zipper tape and don't snip any of the decorative stitches. <i>Tip: Find the zipper tab and push the point of your scissors or a seam ripper in at that point. It will protect your zipper tape from an accidental slit.</i>		
13	Steam press the stitching lines to set the seam. Use a pressing cloth if necessary to protect the fabric and zipper.		
14	Open the zipper the whole way. <i>Tip: If the zipper won't move, reach in and flip the tab upward. The zipper is locked when the tab is pointed down. It sometimes helps to push the zipper closed a bit and then push it open.</i>		
15	Turn the case thru the opening in the zipper. Use a point turner to help turn the case and push the edges of the seams outward.		
16	Steam press the case being very careful not to melt the zipper. Use a pressing cloth to protect the fabric and zippers.		
17A	Apply a KamSnap over the placement circle in the curved end of one strap loop. The CAP goes on the FRONT. The STUD goes on the BACK.		
17B	Apply a KamSnap over the 2nd circle in the center of the strap loop. The CAP goes on the Front and the SOCKET goes on the BACK.		
17C	Repeat for other loop.		
17D	Insert the tab into a metal ring and snap closed.		

Finish the cut ends of your strap using your favorite method. Loop the cut ends through the rings on two gate clips, and sew the loop shut across the cut end. Don't forget to add a slider to one side if you want to make your strap adjustable.
Clip the gate clips to the metal rings

on the purse.
