



## Cap'n Pegbeard

Appliqué

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### Preparation.

1. Cut background, hat, head and body shapes from cardstock. You can use my SVG files in your favorite cutting software and cut with an electronic cutter. Or you can stitch the placement stitch on cutaway stabilizer, cut them out and use them as patterns.
2. Cut background, hat, head, body, scarf and eyepatch shapes out of fabric or other suitable material, including paper. You can use my SVG files in your favorite cutting software and cut with an electronic cutter. Or you can stitch the placement stitch on cutaway stabilizer, cut them out and use them as patterns. *I fused HeatNBond Lite to the backs of my fabrics before cutting.*
3. Fuse the pieces for the background, hat, head and body to one side of their cardboard mates.

### Background

Hoop crisp tearaway stabilizer in 5x7 hoop. Load CardFront.\*\*\* in your machine.

1. Stitch Color #1, the placement stitching.
2. Apply washable glue stick onto the stabilizer inside the stitching lines. Place the prepared background fabric/cardstock shape inside the placement lines. *Give the glue a minute to take hold.*
3. Stitch Color #2, the bean stitch topstitching.

Remove the project from the hoop and carefully tear the stabilizer away from the edges. *It can remain inside the stitching lines.*

Lay aside.

## Cap'n Pegbeard

Hoop crisp tearaway stabilizer in 5x7 hoop. Load CapnPGBRD4.\*\*\* in your machine. Thread colors are your choice.

1. Stitch Color #1, the placement stitching.
2. Apply washable glue stick onto the stabilizer inside the stitching lines for the body (bottom rectangle). Place the prepared fabric/cardstock shape inside the placement lines. *Give the glue a minute to take hold.*

Stitch Color #2, the bean stitch topstitching.

3. Apply washable glue stick onto the stabilizer inside the stitching lines for the head (large circle). Place the prepared fabric/cardstock shape inside the placement lines. *Give the glue a minute to take hold.*

Stitch Color #3, the bean stitch topstitching.

4. Apply washable glue stick onto the stabilizer inside the stitching lines for the eye patch. Place the prepared fabric shape inside the placement lines. *Give the glue a minute to take hold.*

Stitch Color #4, the bean stitch topstitching on the eye patch and the face.

5. Apply washable glue stick onto the stabilizer inside the stitching lines for the hat. Place the prepared fabric shape inside the placement lines. *Give the glue a minute to take hold.*

Stitch Color # 5, the outline of the hat crown (same color as hat material).

6. Stitch Color #6, the bean stitch topstitching.
7. Apply washable glue stick onto the stabilizer inside the stitching lines for the scarf Place the prepared fabric shape inside the placement lines. *Give the glue a minute to take hold.*

Stitch Color #7, the bean stitch topstitching.

Remove the stabilizer from the hoop separate the pieces. Remove the stabilizer from the edges. It can remain on the backs.

Put your Cap'n Pegbeard together by layering the pieces onto a pre-made card base as shown in the photo. I added yarn hair between the scarf and head and added a large jump ring for an earring. You can use narrow black ribbon as straps for the eye patch. A pink ribbon bow and stick-on jewels are the finishing touches.
